Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to identify and understand long vowel sounds in words related to Taylor Swift.

Materials and Prep

Materials: Paper, pencil, Taylor Swift song lyrics.

Prep: Familiarize yourself with Taylor Swift's songs and lyrics.

Activities

- 1. Listen to a Taylor Swift song and write down words with long vowel sounds.
- 2. Create a word search puzzle with Taylor Swift song titles that have long vowels.
- 3. Write a short story using at least five words with long vowels inspired by Taylor Swift.

Talking Points

- Long vowels sound like their names. For example, the letter 'a' in 'cake' says 'aay'.
- When a word has a silent 'e' at the end, it usually makes the vowel before it a long sound. Like in the word 'time'.
- Words with two vowels together often make the first vowel a long sound, like in 'rain'.
- Some long vowel sounds can be found in Taylor Swift's song titles, such as 'Love Story' or 'Fearless'.
- Practice saying and writing words with long vowel sounds to become more familiar with them.
