Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to plan, shoot, and edit a short film independently.

Materials and Prep

- Camera or smartphone with video recording capabilities
- Access to a computer with video editing software
- Basic understanding of camera angles and shots

Activities

- **Brainstorming:** Encourage the student to come up with a short script or story idea for their film.
- **Storyboarding:** Have the student sketch out a storyboard with different scenes and camera angles for their film.
