Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to understand and create similes effectively.

Activities

- Activity 1: Simile Scavenger Hunt Search around your house or backyard to find objects that can be described using similes. Write down your findings and share them with someone.

- Activity 3: Simile Charades Act out different similes without speaking, and see if someone can guess what you are portraying. Have fun with this creative and interactive activity!

Talking Points

• What is a simile?

"A simile is a figure of speech that compares two different things using the words 'like' or 'as'. For example, 'Her smile is as bright as the sun'."

- Why do we use similes? "Similes help us create vivid images in our writing and make comparisons more interesting and engaging for the reader."
- Examples of similes

"Can you think of some common similes that we use in everyday language, such as 'as busy as a bee' or 'as light as a feather'?"
