Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will have a deeper understanding of the themes and characters in The Magician's Nephew by C.S. Lewis.

Materials and Prep

- Copy of The Magician's Nephew by C.S. Lewis
- Paper and pen for notes
- Access to a computer for research

Activities

- **Character Analysis:** Choose a character from the book and create a character profile detailing their traits, motivations, and how they contribute to the story.
- **Theme Exploration:** Identify a theme in the book (e.g., friendship, bravery) and find specific examples from the text that support this theme. Write a short paragraph explaining how this theme is developed throughout the story.
- **Creative Writing:** Imagine you are a character in The Magician's Nephew. Write a journal entry from their perspective describing a key event from the book.

Talking Points
