

Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will have a better understanding of the themes and characters in The Magician's Nephew by C.S. Lewis.

Materials and Prep

- Copy of The Magician's Nephew by C.S. Lewis
- Paper and pencils
- Internet access for research

Activities

1. Character Analysis: Choose a character from the book and create a character profile. Include their traits, motivations, and actions.
2. Theme Exploration: Identify a major theme in the book and write a short paragraph explaining its significance.
3. Creative Writing: Write a short story imagining a new adventure for the characters in The Magician's Nephew.

Talking Points

- What is the main setting of the story?
 - "The story begins in London, but takes us to a magical world called Charn and then to the mysterious world of Narnia."
- Who are the main characters in the book?
 - "The main characters are Digory Kirke, Polly Plummer, Uncle Andrew, and Aslan the lion."
- What is the significance of the magical rings in the story?
 - "The rings allow the characters to travel between different worlds, leading to exciting adventures and discoveries."
- How does the theme of temptation play out in the book?
 - "Uncle Andrew's desire for power and Digory's struggle with temptation are important themes that drive the plot."
