Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will have a deeper understanding of the themes and characters in "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" by C.S. Lewis through engaging activities across various subjects.

Materials and Prep

- Copy of "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe"
- Art supplies (paper, pencils, colors)
- Internet access for research
- Music player for listening to relevant music
- Comfortable clothing for Physical Education activities

Activities

- Art: Create a visual representation of a key scene from the book using your preferred art medium.
- **English:** Write a short story imagining a new adventure for the characters in the book.

- **Physical Education:** Create a workout routine inspired by the characters in the book (e.g., Aslan's strength).
