

## Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to read and understand basic information about space.

## Materials and Prep

- Paper and pencils
- Space-themed picture book
- Internet access (optional)

## Activities

1. Start by asking the student what they already know about space. Write down their responses on the paper.
2. Read a space-themed picture book together. Discuss the pictures and ask questions to engage the student in conversation.
3. If you have internet access, search for images of planets, stars, and astronauts. Show the images to the student and ask them to describe what they see.
4. Ask the student to draw their favorite thing about space on the paper. Encourage them to use colors and details.
5. Write a sentence or two about the drawing, using simple words. Ask the student to read the sentence(s) aloud.

## Kindergarten Grade Talking Points

- "Space is a big place that has planets, stars, and astronauts."
- "Astronauts are people who go to space in special spaceships called rockets."
- "Planets are big round objects that go around the sun. Earth is a planet."
- "Stars are bright and shiny objects in the sky. They give us light at night."
- "Space is very dark and there is no air to breathe."
- "We can learn about space by looking at pictures and reading books."
