

Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will learn about caring for a rabbit and have fun exploring different subjects related to rabbits.

Materials and Prep

- Stuffed rabbit toy or picture of a rabbit
- Paper and coloring supplies
- Rabbit-themed storybook
- Basic math manipulatives (counters or blocks)
- Access to online rabbit sounds or music

No prior knowledge needed, just come with curiosity and enthusiasm!

Activities

- Create a drawing or collage of a rabbit's habitat

Draw or cut out pictures of grass, carrots, and a cozy burrow for the rabbit.

- Read a rabbit-themed storybook

Listen to a story about a rabbit and discuss the main characters and plot.

- Count rabbit-themed objects

Use math manipulatives to count how many carrots or rabbits you have.

- Listen to rabbit sounds

Close your eyes and listen to different rabbit sounds, then try to mimic them!

- Create a rabbit dance

Move to the rhythm of rabbit-themed music and create your own bunny dance!

Talking Points

- Rabbits are furry animals that hop around. They have long ears and a fluffy tail.

"Rabbits are like fluffy balls that love to hop and play!"

- Rabbits live in burrows underground to stay safe and cozy.

"Rabbits dig tunnels in the ground to make their homes, just like how we have our houses."

- Rabbits enjoy eating carrots, lettuce, and hay as their favorite foods.

"Rabbits munch on yummy carrots and crunchy lettuce to stay healthy and strong!"

- Rabbits can make different sounds like squeaks, purrs, and thumps to communicate.

"Rabbits talk to each other by making cute sounds like squeaks and purrs!"

- Rabbits like to play and explore their surroundings, so they need lots of space to hop around.

"Rabbits love to hop and play, so they need a big area to have fun just like we do!"
