Objective

Activities

- 2. Comparison Chart: Create a chart comparing the characteristics of the two animals you chose.
- 3. Debate: Present your findings and debate with a family member or friend on which animal would win in a fight, providing evidence to support your argument.

Talking Points

- **Animal Characteristics:** "Let's start by looking at the size, defense, attack capabilities, agility, and strength of each animal."
- **Preferred Environments:** "Consider whether the animals would fight better in water or on land based on their natural habitats."
- **Comparing Animals:** "Create a chart to compare the key characteristics of the two animals to help you make an informed decision."
- **Evidence-Based Debate:** "When debating, provide evidence to support your argument, such as how the size or agility of an animal could impact the outcome of a fight."
- **Critical Thinking:** "Think critically about the strengths and weaknesses of each animal to make a well-reasoned argument."
