## **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, Ethan will have a better understanding of the Battle of Bannockburn and its significance in history.

## **Materials and Prep**

## **Activities**

- **Research Time:** Use the internet to research and find information about Edward I and the Battle of Bannockburn.
- Map Exploration: Locate the site of the Battle of Bannockburn on a map. Compare it to where you live.
- **Role Play:** Act out a scene from the battle with family members. You can be Edward I or a Scottish soldier!
- **Creative Writing:** Write a short story from the perspective of a soldier in the battle. How did they feel? What did they see?

## **Talking Points**

- Introduction to Edward I: "Edward I was a powerful king of England who had ambitions to conquer Scotland."
- Lead-up to the Battle: "The Battle of Bannockburn took place in 1314 between the Scots, led by Robert the Bruce, and the English army of Edward II."
- **Significance of the Battle:** "The Scots won a decisive victory at Bannockburn, securing their independence from England."
- Legacy of the Battle: "The Battle of Bannockburn is remembered as a turning point in Scottish history and a symbol of Scottish resistance."
