

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a comprehensive understanding of the Cold War, its key events, and its impact on global politics. They will be able to identify major figures, dates, and ideologies that defined the era, and express their thoughts creatively through discussion and activities.

Materials and Prep

- Notebook and pen for notes and reflections
- Access to a computer or device for research (optional)
- Art supplies (colored pencils, markers, paper) for creative activities
- Printed timeline of the Cold War (can be created beforehand)

Activities

- **Cold War Timeline Creation:**

The student will create a timeline of significant events during the Cold War, highlighting at least ten key events. They can use drawings or symbols to represent each event, making it visually engaging.

- **Debate: Capitalism vs. Communism:**

The student will engage in a friendly debate, taking on the role of either a capitalist or a communist. They will prepare arguments to defend their assigned ideology, helping them understand the perspectives of both sides during the Cold War.

Talking Points

- "The end of the Cold War in 1991 marked a significant shift in global politics; what do you think changed?"
