Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to recognize and name at least 10 letters of the alphabet, both in uppercase and lowercase forms, and understand the sounds they make.

Materials and Prep

- No special materials are needed for this lesson.
- Be prepared to use your voice and imagination to make the lesson engaging and fun!
- Know the names and sounds of the letters you want to focus on.

Activities

- Letter Hunt: Go on a letter hunt around the house! Ask the student to find items that start with specific letters, like "A" for apple or "B" for book. This helps them connect letters with sounds and objects.
- Letter Sounds Song: Create a fun song using the letters of the alphabet. Sing together while emphasizing the sounds of each letter. For example, "A says 'ah', B says 'buh'!" This makes learning sounds enjoyable.
- Letter Art: Use your fingers to draw letters in the air or on the ground. You can also pretend to be different animals that start with each letter, like "C for cat!" This adds movement and creativity to learning.

Talking Points

- "Can you find something that starts with the letter A? What is it?"
- "Let's sing our alphabet song together! What sound does the letter B make?"
- "Can you show me how to write the letter C in the air? Great job!"
- "What letter do you think is the first letter in your name? Let's say it together!"
- "Remember, letters help us make words! What word can we make with the letter D?"
