Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will learn about the Philippines, including its culture, language, and some fun facts, fostering curiosity and appreciation for different countries.

Materials and Prep

- Paper
- Crayons or markers
- Small objects or toys to represent Filipino culture (if available)
- Knowledge of basic facts about the Philippines (like its location and language)

Activities

• Philippines Map Drawing:

Have the student draw a simple map of the Philippines. Explain that the Philippines is made up of many islands and show them where it is located on a world map if available.

• Colorful Flag Creation:

Guide the student to create their own version of the Philippine flag using paper and crayons. Talk about the colors and symbols in the flag.

• Filipino Food Pretend Play:

Discuss popular Filipino foods like adobo or lumpia. Encourage the student to pretend to cook these dishes using their toys or play kitchen.

• Language Fun:

Introduce some basic Filipino words or phrases, like "Salamat" (Thank you) and "Kamusta" (How are you?). Practice saying them together.

Talking Points

- "The Philippines is a group of islands in the ocean. Can you count how many islands you can find?"
- "This is the Philippine flag! It has three stars and a sun. Can you color it in with bright colors?"
- "In the Philippines, people eat yummy foods like rice and chicken. What is your favorite food?"
- "We can say 'Salamat' to say thank you in Filipino. Can you say that with me?"
