# **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to express simple words and phrases clearly, improving their speech articulation and confidence in speaking.

## **Materials and Prep**

- No specific materials are needed, just a comfortable space to play and talk.
- Prepare to engage the child with enthusiasm and encouragement.
- Be ready to repeat words and phrases to model clear speech.

### **Activities**

#### • Animal Sounds Game:

Make animal sounds together! Take turns making sounds of different animals and encourage the child to repeat them. This will help with articulation and sound recognition.

#### • Story Time with Actions:

Read a short story and act out the characters together. Encourage the child to say words or phrases related to the story as they act, helping them practice their speech in a fun way.

### • Sing Songs:

Choose a simple song and sing together. Encourage the child to join in on the words. Singing helps with rhythm and pronunciation.

#### • Imitative Play:

Play a game where you say a word and the child has to imitate you. Use simple words like "ball," "car," or "dog." This helps them practice sounds and words in a playful manner.

### **Talking Points**

- "Can you make the sound of a cow? It goes 'moo'!"
- "Let's be the characters in our story! What does a lion say?"
- "Singing is fun! Can you sing with me? Let's say 'la la la!"
- "Can you say 'ball' after me? 'Ball!' Great job!"
