

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a basic understanding of the Roman Empire, including its geography, culture, and important historical figures. The student will also engage in fun activities to reinforce their learning and spark their interest in history.

Materials and Prep

- Paper and colored pencils or markers
- A large map of the Roman Empire (can be drawn or printed)
- Access to a timeline of Roman history (can be created together)
- Craft supplies for building a model (e.g., cardboard, scissors, glue)

Talking Points

- "The Pax Romana was a long period of peace in the Roman Empire. It lasted about 200 years and allowed trade and culture to flourish!"
- "Roman soldiers were known for their discipline and training. They played a key role in expanding and protecting the empire!"
- "Emperors like Augustus helped to establish a strong government and made Rome a powerful city!"
- "The fall of the Roman Empire was a complex event involving many factors, including invasions and economic troubles. It teaches us that even great empires can decline!"
