## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand the main themes of the fable "The Frog Prince," including friendship, kindness, and the importance of keeping promises. The student will also engage in creative activities that enhance their understanding of the story and its characters.

## **Materials and Prep**

- Pencil and paper for drawing and writing
- Space to act out scenes from the story
- Time to read the fable together
- Imagination for creative activities

Before the lesson, familiarize yourself with the fable "The Frog Prince" so you can guide the discussion and activities effectively.

## Activities

• **Read the Fable**: Together, read the story of "The Frog Prince." Discuss the characters and plot as you go along.

After reading, ask the student what they thought about the story. Did they like the frog? What would they have done in the princess's place?

• **Character Drawing**: Have the student draw their favorite character from the story, whether it's the frog, the princess, or even the king.

Encourage them to think about what colors they would use and why. This helps them express their understanding of the characters.

• Act It Out: Choose a scene from the story and act it out together. One can be the princess and the other the frog.

This activity helps the student understand the emotions and actions of the characters, making the story come alive!

• Write a New Ending: Ask the student to write a new ending for the fable. What if the frog turned into a prince but then decided to stay a frog?

This encourages creativity and critical thinking as they explore different possibilities for the story.

## **Talking Points**

- "What do you think the frog wanted when he asked the princess for help?"
- "Why do you think the princess was upset at first?"
- "What does it mean to keep a promise, like the princess did?"
- "How did the frog feel when the princess finally helped him?"
- "Can you think of a time when you helped someone? How did it feel?"
- "Why is it important to be kind to others, even if they look different?"
- "What lesson do you think we can learn from the story of The Frog Prince?"
