

## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand how to play Uno, including the rules and strategies, and will be able to play a game confidently with family or friends.

## Materials and Prep

- Uno card deck
- A flat surface to play on
- Space for players to sit comfortably

Before the lesson, make sure the Uno deck is complete with all cards present. Familiarize yourself with the rules of Uno to explain them clearly to the student.

## Activities

### • Introduction to the Game

Start by explaining the basic rules of Uno, showing the different types of cards: number cards, action cards, and wild cards. Use simple language and examples.

### • Practice Sorting Cards

Have the student sort the Uno cards by color and number. This will help them understand the different cards and prepare for gameplay.

### • Play a Practice Game

Set up a practice game with just two players (you and the student). Focus on taking turns, playing cards, and following the rules. Emphasize having fun!

### • Explore Strategies

Discuss some basic strategies for winning, like keeping a variety of colors and using wild cards wisely. Encourage the student to think about their moves.

### • Play a Full Game

Once the student feels comfortable, play a full game of Uno. Celebrate their wins and encourage them when they lose, reminding them that it's all about fun!

## Talking Points

- "Uno is a fun card game where we try to be the first to get rid of all our cards!"
- "Look! We have different colors and numbers. Can you help me sort them?"
- "When it's your turn, you can play a card that matches the color or number on the top card!"
- "What do you think will happen if you play a wild card? You can change the color!"
- "Remember, it's okay to lose! The most important part is that we have fun together!"
- "Do you have any strategies in mind? Let's think about how we can win!"
