Objective

By the end of this lesson, Nate will be able to build a simple Lego structure using creativity and problem-solving skills. He will learn to follow instructions, enhance his fine motor skills, and express his imagination through building.

Materials and Prep

- Assorted Lego bricks
- Baseplate for building
- Instruction sheet for a simple Lego model (like a car or house)
- Timer (optional, for timed challenges)

Before starting, make sure all Lego pieces are clean and sorted. Have a clear workspace for building, and ensure Nate is comfortable and ready to create!

Activities

• Building Challenge:

Nate will receive a set of instructions to build a simple model, such as a car or a house. This will help him practice following directions and using different Lego pieces.

• Free Build Time:

After completing the challenge, Nate can use his imagination to create anything he wants! This is his time to be creative and explore different designs.

• Color Sorting Game:

Before building, Nate can sort the Lego pieces by color. This will help him develop organizational skills and understand colors better.

Speed Build Race:

Set a timer and see how quickly Nate can build a specific structure. This fun activity can help improve his focus and speed while building.

Talking Points

- "Do you remember how to follow instructions? Let's see how well you can do it with Legos!"
- "What colors do you see in your Lego pile? Can you sort them by color?"
- "What do you want to build with your Legos? Let your imagination run wild!"
- "How fast do you think you can build a car? Let's set a timer and find out!"
- "Can you tell me what pieces you are using and why you chose them?"
- "What was your favorite part of building today? Did you like following the instructions or creating something new?"
