## **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, Jordan will have a comprehensive understanding of the basics of real estate, including key terminology, the process of buying and selling properties, and the importance of critical thinking and life skills in making informed decisions in real estate. Additionally, Jordan will practice reading, spelling, American Sign Language (ASL), and home economics through engaging activities.

Jordan will learn how to sign basic real estate terms in ASL. He can practice with a family member or record himself. This will help him develop a new skill while reinforcing the vocabulary learned earlier.

#### Logic and Common Sense Puzzles:

Jordan will solve logic puzzles related to real estate scenarios, such as figuring out the best deal among several properties. This will encourage him to apply critical thinking and problem-solving skills.
