

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a deeper understanding of foxes, including their habitat, behavior, and role in the ecosystem. The student will also develop skills in research, creativity, and presentation through engaging activities.

Materials and Prep

- Paper and colored pencils or markers
- A notebook or journal for notes
- Access to a computer or device for research (if available)
- Outdoor space for observation (optional)

Activities

- "Foxes play an important role in their ecosystem by controlling the population of small rodents and insects!"
- "Did you know that Arctic foxes have thick fur to keep them warm in freezing temperatures?"
