Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a better understanding of ocelots, including their habitat, diet, behavior, and importance in the ecosystem. The student will also create a fun project that showcases what they have learned about these fascinating animals.

Materials and Prep

- Paper
- Pencil or pen
- Colored pencils or markers
- Access to a computer or tablet (optional for research)

Before the lesson, it might be helpful to have a brief overview of ocelots, including some interesting facts that can be shared during the lesson.

Activities

1. Ocelot Facts Sheet

The student will create a fact sheet about ocelots. They can include information such as where ocelots live, what they eat, and any interesting behaviors. This will help them organize their thoughts and learn key facts.

2. Ocelot Drawing

Using colored pencils or markers, the student will draw an ocelot in its natural habitat. They can include trees, other animals, and anything else they think would be found in the ocelot's environment.
