

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand the historical significance and cultural aspects of wire wrapping, learn basic wire wrapping techniques, and connect these skills to subjects like math, art, and history.

Materials and Prep

- Wire (preferably copper or aluminum)
- Wire cutters
- Pliers (round-nose and flat-nose)
- Beads or stones (optional for decoration)

- "Art is a way to express yourself. What does your wire piece say about you?"
