Objective

- "When sharing your mod, be sure to explain what it does and how to install it. Clear instructions make it easier for others to enjoy your work!"

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- "Feedback is a gift! It helps you improve your skills and make better mods in the future."
- "Always back up your files before making big changes. This way, you won't lose your hard work!"
- "Remember, modding is about creativity and having fun. Don't stress too much about perfection!"
