Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a deeper understanding of Veteran's Day, its significance, and the sacrifices made by veterans. The student will also develop skills in research, creativity, and presentation through various engaging activities.

Materials and Prep

- Notebook or journal for writing
- Pens or pencils
- Access to the internet (for research)
- Art supplies (colored pencils, markers, or crayons)
- Printer (optional, for printing pictures or quotes)

Before the lesson, familiarize yourself with the history of Veteran's Day, including its origins and how it is celebrated in different communities.
