

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will create a home education project that explores themes, characters, and moral lessons from the TV series "Supernatural," while also incorporating elements from the national curriculum such as English, History, and Science.

Materials and Prep

- Notebook or sketchbook for notes and drawings
- Pens, pencils, and colored markers
- Access to episodes of "Supernatural" (if available for viewing)
- Online resources for research (like Wikipedia or fan sites)
- Printed images or fan art (optional)
- Access to a library or online database for historical references

Before the lesson, ensure the student has watched a few episodes of "Supernatural" to become familiar with the characters and themes.

Activities

- **Create Character Profiles:** The student will select their favorite characters from "Supernatural" and create detailed profiles that include their background, personality traits, and development throughout the series. This can help in understanding character arcs and storytelling.

- **Research Mythology:** The student will choose a monster or mythological creature featured in "Supernatural" and conduct research on its origins. They can create a presentation or a poster that explains the creature's history and significance in different cultures.
- **Design a Monster Hunt:** The student will create a fun, fictional "monster hunt" game that includes clues and riddles based on episodes of "Supernatural." This will encourage critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

Talking Points

- "What do you think makes a character memorable? Let's look at how Sam and Dean's personalities are different yet complement each other."
- "Why do you think the show uses mythology and folklore? It adds depth and makes the stories more interesting!"
- "How does the show deal with themes of family and loyalty? Can you find examples from the episodes you've watched?"
- "What lessons can we learn from the challenges the characters face? Think about how they deal with fear and loss."
- "Can you think of a time when you had to face something scary? How did you handle it? Relate this to the characters' experiences."
