

## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a deeper understanding of storytelling elements, character development, and themes in the TV series "Supernatural." They will create a unique project that showcases their learning and personal insights about the series, while also exploring related subjects such as mythology, folklore, and moral lessons.

## Materials and Prep

- Notebook or sketchbook for notes and drawings
- Pens, pencils, and colored markers
- Access to episodes of "Supernatural" (if available for viewing)
- Internet access for research on folklore and mythology
- Basic art supplies (optional for project presentation)

Before the lesson, ensure the student has watched at least one episode of "Supernatural" to discuss key themes and characters. Familiarize yourself with the show's main story arcs, characters, and the folklore it incorporates.

## Activities

### • Character Analysis:
