

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand the significant impacts that the Romans had on Britain, including their contributions to infrastructure, culture, and governance. The student will also be able to identify key Roman figures and events that shaped British history.

Materials and Prep

- Notebook and pencil for note-taking
- Colored markers or crayons for drawing activities
- Access to a map of Roman Britain (can be drawn by the student)
- Printed list of Roman terms and their meanings (to be created beforehand)
- Timer for timed activities

Activities

- **Map Exploration:** The student will create a simple map of Roman Britain, marking important cities, roads, and forts. This will help them visualize where the Romans had influence and how they connected different areas.
- **Role-Playing Game:** The student will choose a Roman figure (like Julius Caesar or Boudicca) and act out a short scene that highlights their role in British history. This activity encourages creativity and helps the student understand different perspectives.
- **Building a Roman Road:** Using crayons or markers, the student will draw a Roman road and label its features, such as milestones, ditches, and drainage systems. This will illustrate the engineering skills of the Romans and their importance in trade and military movement.
- **Roman Influence Discussion:** The student will engage in a discussion about what aspects of Roman culture (like baths, language, and laws) are still present in Britain today. This will reinforce the long-lasting impact of the Romans.

Talking Points

- "Did you know that the Romans built over 10,000 miles of roads in Britain? These roads helped soldiers move quickly and allowed trade to flourish!"
- "The Romans introduced the idea of towns and cities as we know them today. They built places like Londinium, which is now called London!"
- "Roman baths were not just for washing; they were social places where people gathered to relax and talk. Imagine having a spa day with your friends!"
- "The Romans brought their language, Latin, to Britain. Many English words come from Latin. Can you think of any words we use today that might have Roman roots?"
- "Boudicca was a queen who led a rebellion against the Romans. Her story shows that not everyone was happy about Roman rule. What do you think about her fight for freedom?"
