

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have created their own unique beaded bracelet, learning about different bead types, patterns, and basic jewelry-making techniques. This hands-on activity will enhance their creativity and fine motor skills while providing a sense of accomplishment.

Materials and Prep

- Beads of various shapes, sizes, and colors
- Elastic string or cord
- Scissors
- Measuring tape or ruler
- Pencil and paper for sketching designs (optional)
