## **Objective**

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand the importance of sanitation, the history of toilets, and the significance of World Toilet Day, while engaging in fun and educational activities that reinforce these concepts.

## **Materials and Prep**

- Paper and pencil for note-taking and drawing
- Access to a clock or timer for timed activities
- A comfortable space to sit and work on activities
- Basic knowledge of what toilets are and their purpose

### **Activities**

#### • Toilet Trivia Ouiz:

Create a fun trivia quiz about toilets and sanitation. The student can write down questions and then answer them, learning interesting facts along the way.

#### Design Your Own Toilet:

Using paper, the student can sketch their dream toilet. Encourage creativity by allowing them to design features that would make it unique or more efficient.

#### • Toilet History Timeline:

Research and create a timeline of the history of toilets, highlighting key developments and innovations. This can be presented visually on paper.

#### • World Toilet Day Awareness Poster:

Make a poster that raises awareness about World Toilet Day. The student can include facts, drawings, and slogans that promote sanitation and hygiene.

# **Talking Points**

- "Toilets are more than just a convenience; they are vital for public health. Poor sanitation can lead to diseases."
