

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand the significance of King Hezekiah in the Bible, including his reforms, faithfulness to God, and the historical context of his reign. The student will also be able to discuss Hezekiah's contributions to the Kingdom of Judah and the lessons that can be learned from his life.

Materials and Prep

- A notebook or journal for taking notes
- A pen or pencil
