

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a better understanding of Japanese culture, including its traditions, language, and food. They will also create a mini-project that showcases what they have learned about Japan.

Materials and Prep

- Paper and colored pencils or markers
- Access to the internet for research (if available)
- Notebook for notes
- Optional: ingredients for a simple Japanese dish (like rice or sushi rolls)

Before the lesson, it would be helpful to have a brief overview of Japan's geography and major cities, as well as some basic facts about its culture and traditions.

Activities

• Japanese Culture Collage
