Let's Get Started!

- What is a 'cabin' on a cruise ship? (Vocabulary/Detail)
- Where does a cruise ship stop? (Port Vocabulary/Detail)

Creative Time: Draw Your Dream Cruise Ship!

Now, let's use our paper and crayons! Draw your very own cruise ship. Think about what you learned:

- What different parts will your ship have? (Draw decks, maybe a pool?)
- Can you label one or two parts of your ship, like the 'deck' or a 'window'?
- You can even write a simple sentence at the bottom, like "My ship is big." or "I like ships."
