Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to create a visually appealing design using Canva, showcasing their creativity and understanding of basic design principles. They will learn how to use various tools within Canva to produce a project that reflects their personal style.

Materials and Prep

- A computer or tablet with internet access
- An active Canva account (free version is sufficient)
- A list of design ideas or themes (e.g., posters, social media posts, book covers)
- Optional: A notebook for brainstorming ideas

Before the lesson, ensure that the student has access to their Canva account and is familiar with the basic layout of the platform. Encourage them to explore the interface a bit before diving into the activities.

Activities
