Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have improved their reading and writing skills through engaging activities. They will learn how to express their thoughts creatively, understand story structure, and enhance their vocabulary.

Materials and Prep

- Pencil and paper for writing
- A favorite book or story for reading
- Colored pencils or markers for drawing
- Timer or stopwatch (optional)

Before the lesson, ensure the student has access to their favorite book or story. Discuss what they like about it to spark interest in reading and writing.

Activities

• Story Mapping:

Ask the student to choose a favorite story and create a story map. They will draw the main characters, setting, and plot points. This will help them understand the structure of a story.

• Creative Writing Prompt:

Give the student a fun writing prompt, such as "If you could have any superpower, what would it be and why?" Set a timer for 15 minutes for them to write a short story or paragraph about it.

• Character Diary:

Have the student pick a character from their favorite book and write a diary entry from that character's perspective. This encourages empathy and deeper understanding of characters.

• Illustrated Vocabulary:

Ask the student to pick five new words they learned from their reading and illustrate them. This will help them remember the words better and expand their vocabulary.

Talking Points

- "What did you like most about your favorite character? Understanding characters helps us relate to them!"
- "How do you feel when you read a story? Reading can take us on adventures without leaving our homes!"
- "What new words did you find? Learning new words helps us express ourselves better!"
- "Can you think of a time when you wanted a superpower? Writing about our dreams can be really fun!"
