Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand the basics of nail technology, including nail anatomy, hygiene practices, and basic nail art techniques. The student will also be able to demonstrate simple nail care and design on their own nails or a practice hand.

Materials and Prep

- "You can use household items like a toothpick for dotting or tape for clean lines in your designs!"
- "Nail technology is a growing field; if you enjoy it, consider looking into courses or certification!"
- "Always ask for permission before doing nail art on someone else; it's important to respect others' choices!"
- "Keep your workspace organized; a tidy area helps you focus and find your materials easily!"
