

Objective

By the end of this lesson, Children will be able to identify different family members and understand the concept of family through fun activities and interactive play.

Materials and Prep

- No specific materials are needed for this lesson.
- Be ready to engage in storytelling and role-playing.
- Prepare to ask questions and encourage Children to talk about their family.

Activities

- **Family Members Game:** Start by naming family members like mom, dad, brother, sister, etc. Then, ask Children to point to pictures (or use their fingers) to show who is in their family. This helps them connect names and faces.
- **Family Story Time:** Create a simple story about a family going on an adventure. Use characters that represent family members. Encourage Children to join in and act out parts of the story as you read.
- **Role Play:** Pretend to be different family members. For example, act like a mom cooking or a dad reading a book. Encourage Children to join in and mimic the actions. This activity helps them understand roles within a family.
- **Family Tree Drawing:** Together, draw a simple family tree using crayons or markers. Use stick figures to represent each family member. Talk about who is who as you draw, reinforcing their understanding of family connections.

Talking Points

- "Who is in your family? Can you tell me their names?"
- "Look, this is a picture of a mom. Can you show me your mom?"
- "What does your dad like to do? Let's pretend to do that!"
- "In our story, the family goes on an adventure. What adventure do you want to go on with your family?"
- "Let's draw your family! Who should we draw first?"
