

## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will understand the basic rules of Bingo, learn how to create their own Bingo cards, and enjoy playing the game with family or friends. The student will also develop skills in number recognition and social interaction.

## Materials and Prep

- Pencil and paper
- Markers or colored pencils
- List of numbers from 1 to 75 (for traditional Bingo)
- Timer (optional)

Before the lesson, make sure to explain the basic rules of Bingo and how the game is played. Familiarize yourself with the different ways to win in Bingo, such as completing a row, column, or diagonal.

## Activities

### • Create Your Own Bingo Cards:

The student will design their own Bingo cards using a grid format. They can choose numbers from the list provided, and decorate their cards with drawings or stickers for a personal touch.

### • Bingo Call Game:

The student will take turns calling out numbers from the list while another family member or friend marks them on their Bingo card. This activity helps with number recognition and encourages social interaction.

### • Bingo Variations:

Discuss and play different versions of Bingo, such as "Four Corners" or "Blackout Bingo," where players must cover all squares. This keeps the game exciting and introduces new rules!

### • Timed Bingo Challenge:

Set a timer and see how quickly the student can mark off a row, column, or diagonal on their Bingo card. This adds an element of excitement and competition to the game!

## Talking Points

- "Bingo is a fun game where we listen for numbers and try to make a pattern on our card!"
- "Each Bingo card has a mix of numbers. Can you find the number I just called?"
- "What happens when you get five in a row? That's right, you shout 'Bingo!'"
- "Why do you think we decorate our Bingo cards? It makes them special and unique!"
- "Can you think of other games that use numbers? Let's compare them!"
- "How do you feel when you win a round of Bingo? Winning is exciting!"
- "What strategies can you use to remember the numbers that have been called?"
- "If we change the rules a little, how does that make the game different?"
- "What was your favorite part of making and playing Bingo today?"
