Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will be able to understand and explain how social studies concepts like community, culture, and economics are represented in the game Roblox, while also improving their English language skills through creative expression and discussion.

Materials and Prep

- Access to Roblox on a computer or device
- Notebook or digital document for note-taking
- Writing tools (pencil, pen, or keyboard)
- Optional: Access to a video chat platform for discussion (if applicable)

Before starting the lesson, familiarize yourself with different Roblox games that showcase various cultures, communities, or economic systems. This will help guide discussions and activities.

Activities

Explore and Analyze:

The student will spend time exploring different Roblox games that represent various cultures or communities. They will take notes on the features they observe, such as architecture, social interactions, and economic activities within the game.

• Create a Roblox Game Concept:

Using their notes, the student will design their own Roblox game concept that reflects a specific culture or community. They will write a brief description of their game, including its setting, objectives, and what players can learn from it.

Presentation:

Talking Points

- "Roblox is not just a game; it's a way to explore different cultures and communities. Can you think of a game that represents a specific culture?"
- "When we look at the architecture in Roblox, what can it tell us about the community it represents?"
- "How do you think the economy in a Roblox game works? What are some ways players can earn or spend 'Robux'?"
- "Creating your own game is a great way to express your understanding of a culture. What elements will you include to make it authentic?"
- "Presenting your ideas helps you communicate your thoughts clearly. Why is it important to share your game concept with others?"
- "What did you learn about teamwork and community while playing Roblox? How can those lessons apply in real life?"
