

Objective

By the end of this lesson, Brodi will have a deeper understanding of how to create and play educational games using Kahoot, enhancing his knowledge retention and making learning more interactive and fun.

Materials and Prep

- Access to a computer or tablet with internet connection
- Kahoot account (can be created for free)
- Headphones (optional, for a more immersive experience)
- A list of topics Brodi is interested in (to create Kahoot quizzes)

Before the lesson, ensure that Brodi has created a Kahoot account and is familiar with the platform's interface. It might be helpful to have a few topics in mind for quiz creation.

Activities

• Quiz Creation:

Brodi will select a topic he enjoys and create a Kahoot quiz with at least 10 questions. This will help him learn how to formulate questions and answers effectively.

Talking Points

- "Kahoot is a great way to make learning fun! It turns studying into a game."
- "When creating your quiz, think about the key concepts you want to remember. What questions would help you recall that information later?"
- "Don't hesitate to be creative! Use images and videos in your Kahoot to make it more engaging."
- "Playing with friends can help you learn better. You can discuss the answers and learn from each other."
- "If you get a question wrong, it's not a failure; it's a chance to learn something new!"
- "Kahoot allows you to see how others think. Pay attention to the answers your friends choose and why."
- "Take note of the types of questions that get the most laughs or discussions. Those are often the most memorable!"
- "Reflecting on your experience can help you improve your next quiz. What worked? What didn't?"

- "You can use Kahoot for any subject! Math, science, history—it's all fair game!"
- "Remember, the more you practice creating quizzes, the better you'll get at it!"
- "Kahoot can also be used for revision before tests. It's a fun way to recap what you've learned."
- "Don't forget to share your quizzes with others! They might find them helpful too."
- "Using Kahoot can help you build confidence in your knowledge and presentation skills."
- "Think about what you enjoy most about learning. How can you incorporate that into your quizzes?"
- "Lastly, have fun! The goal is to make learning enjoyable, so let your creativity shine!"
