Objective

By the end of this lesson, Ysabell will have a comprehensive understanding of traffic and road signs, including their meanings, importance, and how they help ensure safety on the roads. Ysabell will also create a unique road sign to demonstrate her learning creatively.

Materials and Prep

- Paper
- Colored pencils or markers

Activities

- "Creating your own road sign is a fun way to express what you think is important for safety on the roads. What message do you want to share?"
- "When you see a sign, think about what it means and why it is there. Every sign has a purpose!"
- "Understanding traffic signs is not just for drivers; it's important for everyone who uses the road, including pedestrians and cyclists."
