Objective

By the end of this lesson, Ysabell will be able to identify and understand the meaning of various traffic and road signs. She will also learn how these signs contribute to road safety and the importance of following them while driving or walking.

Materials and Prep

- Paper
- Colored pencils or markers
- Access to a computer or tablet (optional for research)
- Printed images of various traffic signs (can be drawn if printing is not available)

Before the lesson, ensure that Ysabell has a basic understanding of what traffic signs are and their purpose. Familiarize her with common signs she might see on the road.

Activities

- **Traffic Sign Scavenger Hunt:** Create a scavenger hunt where Ysabell has to find and identify different traffic signs around your neighborhood. She can take photos or draw them as she finds each one.
- **Design Your Own Traffic Sign:** Have Ysabell create her own traffic sign that represents a new rule she thinks should exist. She can explain the meaning and importance of her sign to you.
- **Traffic Sign Bingo:** Create bingo cards with different traffic signs on them. As you call out the names of the signs, Ysabell can mark them on her card. This can be a fun way to reinforce her knowledge.
- **Role-Playing Scenarios:** Set up role-playing scenarios where Ysabell can practice how to respond to various traffic signs while pretending to be a driver or a pedestrian. This will help her understand the practical application of the signs.

Talking Points

- "Traffic signs are essential for keeping everyone safe on the road. Can you think of why that might be?"
- "Each sign has a specific meaning. What do you think would happen if people didn't follow them?"
- "Designing your own sign is a great way to express what you think is important for road safety. What message do you want to convey?"
- "When you see a stop sign, what should you do? Let's discuss how to react to different signs!"
- "Remember, understanding traffic signs helps not just drivers, but also pedestrians and cyclists. Why do you think that is important?"
