Link English and PDHPE Outcomes to 'Sweet Tooth' for 15-Year-Old Students Explore the Netflix series 'Sweet Tooth' and how it connects with the New South Wales Stage 4 and 5 English and PDHPE curriculum outcomes for 15-year-olds. Note which outcome it realtes to for example EN4-1A / Lesson Planner / LearningCorner.co

### Objective

By the end of this lesson, Benobo will have a deeper understanding of the themes and character development in the Netflix series 'Sweet Tooth'. He will analyze how these elements connect to the New South Wales Stage 4 and 5 English and PDHPE curriculum outcomes, particularly focusing on EN4-1A and PDH4-1. Additionally, Benobo will explore the emotional and social implications presented in the series, fostering critical thinking and personal reflection.

### **Materials and Prep**

- Access to Netflix to watch selected episodes of 'Sweet Tooth'
- Notebook and pen for taking notes
- Discussion questions prepared in advance
- Access to the New South Wales curriculum outcomes for reference
- A comfortable space for watching and discussing the series

# Activities

#### 1. Episode Viewing:

Watch the first two episodes of 'Sweet Tooth'. Focus on the main characters, their motivations, and the world they inhabit. Take notes on key moments that stand out.

#### 2. Character Analysis:

Choose one main character from the series. Write a character profile that includes their traits, challenges, and growth throughout the episodes. Relate this to the EN4-1A outcome by demonstrating understanding of character development.

#### 3. Theme Exploration:

Identify at least two major themes in 'Sweet Tooth', such as family, identity, or survival. Create a mind map that connects these themes to real-life situations or issues in society, aligning with PDH4-1 outcomes.

### 4. Discussion and Reflection:

Engage in a guided discussion about the episodes watched. Reflect on how the series portrays emotional and social issues, and share personal thoughts on how these relate to Benobo's own experiences.

# **Talking Points**

- "What do you think makes the character of Gus so unique? How does his innocence shape the story?"
- "Consider the world in 'Sweet Tooth'. How does it reflect our own society, especially regarding issues like climate change and community?"
- "How do you feel about the relationships between characters? What do they teach us about trust and friendship?"
- "Think about the themes of survival and identity. How do these themes resonate with your own life experiences?"
- "In what ways do the challenges faced by the characters mirror real-life challenges for young people today?"
- "How does the series encourage empathy towards others? Can you think of a time when you

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- had to show empathy?"
- "What lessons can we learn from Gus's journey about facing fears and stepping out of comfort zones?"
- "How does the artistic style of the show contribute to its storytelling? What elements stood out to you?"
- "Discuss the role of nature in 'Sweet Tooth'. How does it affect the characters and their decisions?"
- "What do you think the creators of 'Sweet Tooth' want us to take away from the series? How does it inspire change?"
- "How does the series address the idea of 'otherness'? What can we learn about acceptance from this?"
- "Reflect on a moment in the series that made you feel strong emotions. What was it, and why did it affect you?"
- "How does the series balance humor and serious themes? Why is this important in storytelling?"
- "What role does hope play in the series? How can hope be a powerful tool in our own lives?"
- "If you could change one thing about the storyline, what would it be and why?"
