### Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a deeper understanding of the role of police officers, the skills required for a career in law enforcement, and the ethical considerations involved in policing. The student will also explore the various paths to becoming a police officer and engage in critical thinking about the responsibilities that come with this profession.

## **Materials and Prep**

- Notebook and pen for taking notes
- Access to a computer or smartphone for research
- Printed articles or resources about law enforcement (optional, if available)
- Preparation: Familiarize yourself with local law enforcement agencies and their roles in the community.

### Activities

### • Role-Playing Scenarios:

Engage in role-playing exercises where the student acts as a police officer responding to various situations, such as a traffic stop or a community event. This helps to understand the decision-making process and the importance of communication skills.

#### • Research Project:

Have the student research a local police department and prepare a short presentation on its history, key initiatives, and community programs. This will give insight into how law enforcement operates within the community.

#### • Debate on Policing Ethics:

Organize a debate on a current issue in law enforcement, such as the use of body cameras or community policing. This encourages critical thinking and allows the student to explore different perspectives on policing.

#### • Guest Speaker (if possible):

If feasible, arrange for a local police officer to speak with the student about their experiences and answer questions. This firsthand insight can be invaluable and inspiring.
