

Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to write a creative story using Hot Wheels as the main theme.

Materials and Prep

- Blank paper
- Pencils or crayons
- Hot Wheels cars (optional)

Prior knowledge of basic writing skills is helpful but not required.

Activities

1. Brainstorming: Have a discussion about Hot Wheels and ask the student to share their favorite car or track. Encourage them to describe the car's features and why they like it.
2. Story Planning: Help the student create a story outline by asking questions such as: Where does the story take place? Who are the characters? What is the problem or challenge they face?
3. Writing the Story: Provide the student with a blank piece of paper and ask them to write their story using their outline as a guide. Encourage them to include descriptive language and details about the Hot Wheels cars and their adventures.
4. Illustrating the Story: After writing the story, give the student the option to illustrate their story using pencils or crayons. They can draw scenes from their story or create their own Hot Wheels designs.
5. Sharing and Feedback: Have the student read their story aloud or share it with a family member. Encourage positive feedback and ask questions about their favorite parts or characters.

Transitional-Kindergarten Grade Talking Points
