

Introduction (15 mins)

- Begin by discussing Roo's interest in Cookie Run: Kingdom, specifically Pure Vanilla Cookie. Ask: What makes Pure Vanilla Cookie a leader? What does his staff look like? What do you think it represents?
- Introduce the idea of ceremonial staffs in real life. Ask: Have you seen staffs used in movies, stories, or pictures? What do you think they are used for? (Examples: marking leadership, special ceremonies, magic).
- Explain the project: Today, you'll become a royal craftsperson and design your own ceremonial staff inspired by Pure Vanilla, using things from nature and some craft supplies!

Activity 1: Nature Walk & Research (30 mins - Science, Social Studies, History)

- Go outside to find a suitable tree branch for the staff's base. Look for one that is sturdy, relatively straight, and a good height for Roo.
- **Science Focus:** While searching, try to identify the type of tree the branch came from. Look at the bark, any remaining leaves, or buds. Discuss decomposers (what happens to branches that fall).
- Return inside. Briefly look up images or short descriptions of real ceremonial staffs from different cultures (e.g., Egyptian pharaohs, Indigenous chiefs, bishops). Discuss their purposes and designs. How are they similar or different from Pure Vanilla's staff?

Activity 2: Design & Measurement (20 mins - Art, Math)

- Lay out the chosen branch and the cardboard.
- **Math Focus:** Measure the length of the branch using a ruler or measuring tape. Decide how tall the staff head (the cardboard part) should be.
- **Art Focus:** Sketch ideas for the staff head on paper. Think about Pure Vanilla's design elements (light, healing, maybe cookie shapes?). Consider shapes “ circles, curves, symmetrical designs. How can cardboard be cut and layered to make it look interesting?

Activity 3: Construction & Decoration (45-60 mins - Art)

- Carefully cut the cardboard shapes designed in the previous step. Adult supervision/help may be needed depending on cardboard thickness.
- Paint the cardboard pieces (perhaps white, gold, yellow like Pure Vanilla's theme) and let them dry.
- Once dry, assemble the cardboard pieces using glue or tape to create the staff head.
- Securely attach the finished cardboard head to the top of the tree branch. Glue or strong tape might work; ensure it's stable.
- Add any final decorations “ perhaps ribbons, yarn, or more paint details on the staff itself.

Activity 4: Storytelling (15 mins - English)

- Now that the staff is complete, imagine its story.
- **English Focus:** Write a short paragraph or tell a story about the staff. What powers does it have? What kingdom is it from? What kind of leader wields it? Describe what it looks like using descriptive words (adjectives).

Conclusion & Sharing (10 mins)

- Have Roo present the staff and share its story or description.
- Discuss the process: What part was most fun? What was challenging? What did you learn about

trees, staffs, or designing things? How did you use math today?

- Connect back to Pure Vanilla: What leadership qualities did you think about while making your staff?
