### Where in the World? Habitat and Home

These tiny felines are native to India and Sri Lanka, with some recent sightings in Nepal. They are quite adaptable and can live in a variety of habitats, including moist and dry deciduous forests, scrublands, grasslands, and even rocky hill slopes. Sometimes, they are even found near human settlements and agricultural areas, probably because food (like rodents) can be easier to find there. They prefer dense vegetation and rocky areas where they can hide and hunt.

### A Tiny Hunter's Menu: What Do They Eat?

Don't let their size fool you; rusty-spotted cats are skilled hunters! They primarily prey on small animals like rodents (mice and rats), small birds, lizards, frogs, and insects. They are mainly nocturnal, meaning they hunt at night. Their small size and agility allow them to sneak up on prey quietly and pounce with precision. They are also excellent climbers and may hunt in trees.

### Why So Special? Unique Traits

Besides being the smallest, what makes them so unique?

- **Super Senses:** Their eyesight is about six times better than a human's, especially in the dark!

or resting among the branches.
