## The Wily Weasel: A Creative Exploration!

### Introduction (10-15 minutes)

- What are some special skills or adaptations weasels have? (e.g., how do they move, hunt, or protect themselves?)
- Can you find a fun or surprising fact about weasels?

# Activity 2: Weasel Wonders - Creative Corner! (30-45 minutes)

Now that you're a weasel expert, it's time to get creative! Choose **one** of the following projects to showcase what you've learned about weasels. Remember to include some of the cool facts or adaptations you discovered!

#### **Option A: Weasel's World Diorama/Drawing**

- Create a detailed drawing or a mini 3D model (using modeling clay, construction paper, etc.) of a weasel in its natural habitat.
- Think about: What does its home look like? What plants or other animals might be nearby? Is your weasel hunting, hiding, or exploring?
- Be ready to explain what parts of your artwork show specific things you learned about weasels (e.g., "I made my weasel long and skinny because they can fit into small burrows," or "This weasel is white because it's winter and they change color to camouflage!").

#### **Option B: The Adventures of Willy the Weasel - Story Time!**

- Write a short story (or tell a story out loud that a grown-up can help you write down) starring a weasel.
- Your story should show off some of the weasel's special skills, like its cleverness, speed, or hunting abilities.
- What kind of adventure does your weasel go on? Does it outsmart another animal? Does it find a tasty meal in a tricky way?
- Be ready to explain how your story highlights real weasel characteristics or behaviors.

#### **Option C: Weasel Superpowers Comic Strip!**

- Design a short comic strip featuring a weasel as a superhero.
- What are its "superpowers"? These should be based on real weasel abilities (e.g., superflexibility to squeeze through tiny spaces, amazing hunting skills, camouflage).
- Show your weasel using its powers in a fun scenario.
- Be ready to point out which weasel facts inspired your superhero's abilities.

- Present your drawing, diorama, story, or comic strip.
