

My Tropical Island Adventure: Exploring the Philippines!

What You'll Need:

- Large sheet of paper or poster board
- Crayons, colored pencils, markers
- Scissors (child-safe)
- Glue stick
- Magazines or old picture books (optional, for cutting out tropical images)
- Recycled materials (e.g., cardboard tubes, small boxes, fabric scraps)

Let's Begin Our Adventure! (Introduction)

Let's find the Philippines on a map or globe! Notice how it's made up of many islands and is near the Earth's equator. This location is what makes it tropical!

Your Creative Missions: (Main Activities)

Mission 1: Design Your Dream Tropical Island!

Imagine you get to design your very own tropical island paradise, inspired by the Philippines! What would it have?

- Think about: Sandy beaches? Tall coconut trees? Colorful coral reefs underwater? Mysterious caves? Hidden waterfalls? Unique animals? What kind of tropical fruits would grow there?
- Use your art supplies, recycled materials, and even playdough to create a **model, diorama, or a detailed drawing** of your dream island.
- Try to include at least three things that make an island 'tropical' and special, like those found in the Philippines (e.g., specific plants like mango trees or orchids, animals like the tarsier or whale shark, features like volcanoes or rice terraces influenced by the climate).
- Give your island a cool name!

Mission 2: Discover Amazing Tropical Life!

The Philippines is home to so many unique animals and plants because it's tropical! Let's become nature detectives.

- With help, use books or the internet to choose **one Philippine animal** (like the Pawikan/sea turtle, an Eagle, a Tarsier, or a Carabao) and **one Philippine plant or fruit** (like a Sampaguita flower, a Narra tree, a Mango, or a Durian).
- Find out: What does it look like? Where in the Philippines might you find it? What does it eat (if it's an animal)? How does it live so well in a warm, tropical place?
- **Share what you learned!** You can:
 - Draw a picture of your animal/plant and label its special parts.

- Make a small model of it using playdough or recycled bits.
- Tell a short, imaginative story about its life in the tropical Philippines.

Mission 3: Plan a Tropical Fiesta!

Filipinos love to celebrate with vibrant festivals called 'fiestas'! Many fiestas celebrate harvests, nature, or local traditions, all connected to their tropical home.

- Let's brainstorm your very own **Filipino-inspired Tropical Festival!**
- What would be the **theme** of your festival? (e.g., "Sunshine and Smiles Festival," "Amazing Animals Fiesta," "Juicy Fruit Jubilee," "Flower Power Parade")
- What **activities** would happen at your festival? (e.g., music, dancing, games, food stalls with tropical treats, costume parade)
- What kind of **decorations** would you use, inspired by the tropics? (e.g., flowers, leaves, colorful banners, fruit displays)
- Draw a poster for your festival or write down your fun ideas!

Show and Tell: Our Tropical Discoveries! (Discussion & Sharing)

It's time to share your amazing creations and discoveries!

- Present your 'Dream Tropical Island' – tell us about its name and special features.
- Share what you learned about your chosen Philippine animal and plant.
- Describe your exciting Tropical Fiesta plan!

Let's talk: What are some of the coolest things about the Philippines being a tropical country? How does being tropical make it a special place to live for people, animals, and plants?
