Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to engage in reading activities related to Star Wars and develop early language arts skills.

Materials and Prep

- Star Wars books or printouts
- Writing materials (pencils, crayons, markers)
- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Tape or glue

No prior knowledge or preparation is required for this lesson.

Activities

- 1. Read a Star Wars book together: Choose a Star Wars book appropriate for preschoolers and read it aloud with your child. Encourage them to follow along and engage in discussions about the characters and events in the story.
- Create a Star Wars bookmark: Provide your child with construction paper, scissors, and art supplies. Help them cut out a rectangular shape from the paper and let them decorate it with Star Wars characters or symbols. This will be their special bookmark for future reading activities.
- 3. Retell a Star Wars story: After reading the book, ask your child to retell the story using their own words. Encourage them to use descriptive language and engage their imagination. You can also ask them questions about the plot, characters, and their favorite parts of the story.
- 4. Write a Star Wars adventure: Ask your child to create their own Star Wars adventure story. Provide them with writing materials and let them write or draw their story on a blank sheet of paper. Encourage them to include their favorite characters and create an exciting plot.

Preschool Grade Talking Points

- "In Star Wars, there are many different characters like Luke Skywalker and Princess Leia."
- "We can read books about Star Wars to learn more about the stories and the characters."
- "When we read a book, we can imagine the characters and what they are doing in the story."
- "We can use our creativity to make a special bookmark with Star Wars characters."
- "We can retell a story by using our own words and remembering what happened."
- "We can create our own Star Wars adventure story by writing or drawing it."
