

# Welcome to Hogwarts: A Reading Adventure!

#### Example Words You Might Find:

- astonish
- enumerate
- reptile
- mantelpiece
- scruffy
- bewildered

### 4. Owl Post Queries (Comprehension Check):

Answer these questions in your journal. Use complete sentences!

- Describe the Dursleys. How do they treat Harry?
- What strange things happen around Harry before he learns he's a wizard?
- Why is Harry so desperate to get the letters?
- Who is Hagrid and what important news does he bring Harry?
- Based on these chapters, describe Harry's personality. Is he brave? Curious? Kind? Use

examples from the text.

## **5. Character Constellations: Meet the Wizards (and Muggles!)**

In your journal, create a small profile for Harry Potter and the Dursleys (Vernon, Petunia, Dudley). Include:

- Name
- Physical description (if given)
- Key personality traits (use adjectives)
- Their relationship to Harry

## **6. Peeking into the Pensieve (Prediction):**

Based on what you've read so far, what do you predict will happen next? What challenges might Harry face? What are you most excited to find out? Write down your predictions.
